After the Sign of the Cross and Greeting all sit.
The candidate steps forward and formally requests

Father of mercy, we thank you for your servant. You have sought and summoned her in many ways and she has turned to seek you. You have called her today and she has answered in your presence: we praise you, Lord, and we bless you.

All: We praise you, Lord, and we bless you.

Diane is then marked with the Sign of the Cross.

Celebrant:

Receive the cross on your forehead. It is Christ himself who now strengthens you with this sign of his love. Learn to know him and follow him.

All: Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!



After the Homily, the new catechumen and candidates receive a book containing the Holy Gospels (Sunday Missal).

Celebrant:

Diane, Joseph, Lucas, Marthese, Giuseppe: Receive the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

Each is presented with a Sunday Missal

Celebrant:

Diane, Joseph, Lucas, Marthese, Giuseppe: although you cannot yet participate in the Lord's Eucharist, stay with us as a sing of our hope that all God's children will eat and drink with the Lord and work with the Holy Spirit to re-create the face of the earth.



When St Paul tells us to rejoice always, it might seem that he is asking the impossible. How can we always feel joyful? Isn't this too much to ask, even today, on Gaudete (or Rejoice) Sunday?

Not according to St Thomas Aquinas!. As we experience God's love for us, we grow in love for him—and this exchange of love is what produces joy in us. St Paul also knew that God's love was the secret to joy, which is why he follows up his exhortation to 'rejoice always' with specific steps that we can take to experience his love more deeply:

First, pray without ceasing. When we open our heart to God throughout the day, he fills it with his very self. The experience of his unconditional love and unending ignites our love in return.

Second, in all circumstances give thanks. Gratitude also deepens our love for God, especially when we reflect on who he is and what he has done for us. And in this Advent season, whatever our circumstances, we can thank God for sending his Son to earth to become one of us.

Finally, do no quench the Spirit. In his Letter to the Romans, St Paul tells us that 'the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit'. If we want more joy in our lives, we can ask the Spirit to stir up the love of God in our hearts. And when he does, we can express it by praising him—which will, in turn, increase our joy.

Joy is not just for Gaudete Sunday: it's for every day. So each day, follow Paul's advice: turn to the Lord in prayer, thank him for all he has done for you, and ask him to fill you with more of his Spirit. Then praise him—and let your spirit soar! WAU. org
