Job 7:1-4, 6-7 1 Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23 Mark 1:29-39

Ancient witnesses attribute the second Gospel to John Mark, a cousin of St Barnabas who was a companion of St Paul. He is mentioned several times in the New Testament. The book was written near the year AD 60, while Peter was in Rome. Tradition agrees that Mark was an interpreter of translator for S Peter and that the Gospel was written in Rome for Gentile Christians. This is shown by Mark's use of language, by the rarity of quotes from the Old Testament, and the fact that conflicts between Jesus and the Pharisees are downplayed in comparison to the other Gospels.

The theme of the Gospel of St Mark is that Jesus is the Son of God and that he is the Messiah promised by the prophets in the Old Testament, but Mark puts special emphasis on the fact the Jesus is a suffering Messiah. Because of this, he is misunderstood by his disciples and rejected by the leaders of Judaism because they were expecting a powerful political Messiah who would, like Moses of old, liberate them from the power of the hated Roman conquerors. Jesus uses the term 'Son of Man' to refer to himself, rather than 'Messiah', which would tend to give the wrong impression of his Person and his mission. Only after his death does he accept the title of 'Messiah', which means 'Christ', or the Kenneth Baker SJ Inside the Bible Anointed One.
